Course Description: This course is designed to orient students for the call to a biblical education. Sessions in the course prepare students for a spiritually purposeful pursuit, give overview to the Bible, enable recognition of the basics of theology, and acquaint them with theological terminology.

Course Objectives:

Cognitive Objectives

Upon completing this course, the student should be able to demonstrate a knowledge of:

- the relationships of the books of the Bible to one another and their contribution to the Canon.
- a timeline of Bible personages and events from Genesis to Revelation.
- the purpose of prayer in his life
- responsibility to faithful stewardship
- the attributes of the Godhead with an understanding of what God in really like
- important biblical and Christian terminology

Affective Objectives

Upon completing this course, the student should be able to demonstrate an appreciation of:

- the role on each of the sixty-six books of the Bible
- God's sovereignty over history and how He is guiding human events to fulfill His glorious plan
- the privilege he has to talk to God, be heard, and have God act on his behalf
- being a particular member of Christ's body, with a unique expression of Christ to others
- his opportunity to make decisions in his life that will evoke a "well done" response from the Master
- knowing and understanding the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom He has sent
- his understanding of biblical and Christian terminology and its practical influence in his life
- who he is in Christ and his exalted and glorious station as a believer in Christ

Applicational Objectives

Upon completion of this course, the student should be able to exemplify what he has learned by being able to:

- verify that he has completed all of the reading, homework papers, quizzes, and exams assigned in this course.
- discuss the principle(s) taught in each session and explain its (their) relevance to his daily life.
- draw and explain a timeline of selected Bible history from Genesis to Revelation.
- articulate the principles taught in all of the sessions in this course, and be able to teach them in a Sunday School or Bible study setting.
