### ***Requirements***

#### **1. Attendance**

It is impossible to lead a church, the worship team, children’s ministry, or any other ministry for that matter without being present. Thus, attendance is essential.

#### **1. Reading**

Theology is an activity done largely through the process of good reading. Read carefully. Read charitably. Read with others. Read with the expectation that you will learn from others, even when you disagree with their main point. Read even when a text is dense and difficult, for you will learn perseverance and fortitude here. Read that which seems trite and obvious, asking how others might object or criticize. Most importantly, read because God was willing to reveal himself in written words, and because we can best witness to God’s grace with corresponding words. Read because words matter in God’s economy of grace.

## 2. Book Review

Each student must write a 500-word book review. In the header please include how many pages you read from the required text

- A. **First paragraph:** No more than 100 words. Needs to state the author's intent in writing the book, and his/her main thesis- this may be a quotation (if so, write down the page number) or it may be your own synopsis.
- B. **Middle paragraphs:** The largest component in your report, but no more than 300 words. What subject(s) and/or chapter(s) did you learn the most from. In this section share what you learned! Try to put things into your own words.  
How did this subject or chapter bring you to the Word? What biblical texts did you study as a result? What did you learn? Don't let a good book keep you from The BOOK!
- C. **Final paragraph:** No more than 100 words. How will something from this book touch or influenced your calling? Be specific and concrete. How did you apply it in your life right now? (Note the past tense: All books in this class can be immediately applied. What questions, issues, and/or disagreements were raised for you as you applied the book in your life?

## 3. Quizzes

Several quizzes will be given to assess the student's retention of key topics and terms to ensure that the student is achieving the course objectives.

## 4. Final Exam

The exam will be on terms and extracts drawn from the readings and theological discussions giving throughout the course. Therefore, read carefully and take good notes during class.
