## **Description and Objectives**

*“He is no fool who gives what he cannot keep to gain that which he cannot lose” – Jim Elliot*

The purpose of discipleship is to bring the believer into a closer fellowship with God and to transform him into the image of Jesus Christ. Salvation is free, but discipleship has a cost. That cost is the Cross and elimination of the self-life. But it is a small cost when compared with the rewards.

This course will cover what discipleship is, why it is so necessary, and how it happens. It will bring out this one great truth – that God is the one who does the discipling, not the believer. Discipleship is not man’s idea. Nor is discipleship something that man can bring to pass. Just like salvation, God is the One behind discipleship.

This course will also cover specific topics such as personal disciples, devotional life, convictions, Body life, relationships, the study life, prayer, trials, the Cross, brokenness, Christian service, and God’s will, and God’s call.

## Attendance

Each class will be split into two sessions of approximately 50 minutes each with a 10-minute break in between. You must attend 80% of scheduled course hours to be eligible to receive credit for this course. For this course, this means you can miss six sessions or three classes. You are expected to be at class on time, both at the start of the class and after the break.

## Note-Taking and Reviews

You are encouraged to take good notes. You are also expected to understand what is being presented. To help with this, you will be supplied with a short review of each class. This review will be the basis of your final exam and will be provided every other week.

## Assignments and Exams

During the semester you will be required to complete three (3) short assignments. These assignments will be due two weeks from the date that they are assigned. Late work will result in a 20% deduction for each week (or part-week) that it is late.

During the semester Pastor Feyers will assign prayer and reading assignments. These assignments will be graded on an “honor-code” system

You will be required to take a final exam at the end of the semester, which will be in two parts

- Closed-notebook. This will be based in the review which students will have received during the semester and the answers to the assignments. The purpose of this part of the exam is to see how much students **remember** from the semester.
- Open-notebook. This will be based on everything presented during the semester, including the handouts, the answers to the assignments and the book report. The purpose of this part of the exam is to see how much students **understand** from the semester.

## Grading

Grading will be allocated as follows

- Assignments 60% (20% per assignment)
- Prayer and reading 20%
- Final exam 20%
